They will LISTEN and make you feel SAFE, respected and trusted.

They will only tell the people who NEED TO KNOW to keep you safe.

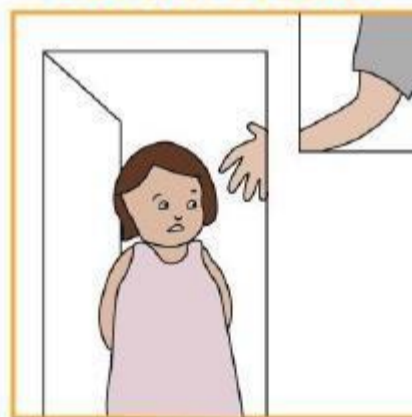
Harm to Your Body that Makes You Feel Pain

Sexual Abuse



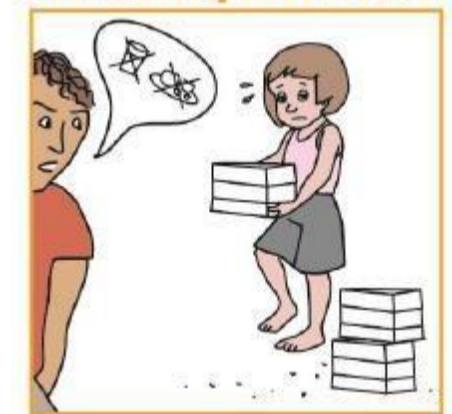
Behaviours that Make You Feel Bad or Embarrassed
